Sermon Series—Romans: Coming Under Grace Pastor Lloyd Pierson, Ph.D. The God of Promise: Romans 4:13-25

¹³For the promise to Abraham and his offspring that he would be heir of the world did not come through the law but through the righteousness of faith. ¹⁴For if it is the adherents of the law who are to be the heirs, faith is null and the promise is void. ¹⁵For the law brings wrath, but where there is no law there is no transgression. ¹⁶That is why it depends on faith, in order that the promise may rest on grace and be guaranteed to all his offspring—not only to the adherent of the law but also to the one who shares the faith of Abraham, who is the father of us all, ¹⁷as it is written, "I have made you the father of many nations"—in the presence of the God in whom he believed, who gives life to the dead and calls into existence the things that do not exist. ¹⁸In hope he believed against hope, that he should become the father of many nations, as he had been told, "So shall your offspring be." 19He did not weaken in faith when he considered his own body, which was as good as dead (since he was about a hundred years old), or when he considered the barrenness of Sarah's womb. ²⁰No unbelief made him waver concerning the promise of God, but he grew strong in his faith as he gave glory to God, ²¹fully convinced that God was able to do what he had promised. ²²That is why his faith was "counted to him as righteousness." ²³But the words "it was counted to him" were not written for his sake alone, ²⁴but for ours also. It will be counted to us who believe in him who raised from the dead Jesus our Lord, ²⁵who was delivered up for our trespasses and raised for our justification.

Sermon

God addresses and speaks to us by the reading and preaching of his Word. Both Christians and non-Christians need to hear the good news of salvation and grow in it.

Questions for Further Reflection:

- 1. Paul expands the promise to Abraham from the land of Canaan to the whole world. How is he able to do this (or what gives him the grounds to expand the promise)?
- 2. Why does the promise of God have to come through faith and not through the law? Why does His grace guarantee that his promise will be fulfilled?
- 3. Sin still exists without the law (Romans 2:12). In what way are you doubly in trouble if you knowingly break the law? (cf. 2 Peter 2:21).
- 4. God will have to create a faithful people (verse 17). How does this strengthen our assurance?
- 5. It seems Paul is being generous with Abraham's "unwavering" trust in the Lord. How is that an encouragement to us?
- 6. Why are we always trying to smuggle in our works to God's grace? What is so unsettling about salvation by grace alone through faith?

Children's Question

We have hope in God because he keeps his promises. Even when things are really hard, we know that he will be with us and never leave us. Have there been times when you have doubted if God would be there through a hard time? How does following Jesus give assurance to your heart?

The Lord's Supper

The gospel is not only heard, but visibly seen as God invites us to commune with him at his table. In the Lord's Supper we remember and experience Jesus' saving work.

CELEBRATION OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

Wine is located in the two outer rings; juice is located in the center ring. (see FCC observance below)

PRAYER FOR THE CONGREGATION

We observe the Lord's Supper each Lord's Day as the climax of our worship service. We invite to the Lord's Table all those who are baptized disciples of Jesus Christ, under the authority of Christ and His body—the Church. Visiting children who have not been examined by their church's leadership, we ask to refrain. By sharing in the Supper, you are acknowledging to our church that you are in covenant with our Triune God through the person and work of Jesus Christ. If you are in doubt about your participation, please refrain. Wine and bread are the elements of the supper as instituted by Jesus Christ. We recommend the use of wine; however we offer both juice and wine in the tray to allow true liberty of conscience.
