# Sermon Series—Romans: Coming Under Grace Pastor John Sackett The Law: Death Brings Life—Romans 7:1-12

Christ's death frees us from death in the Law, raising us to new life, and restoring the good function of the Law.

<sup>1</sup>Or do you not know, brothers—for I am speaking to those who know the law—that the law is binding on a person only as long as he lives? <sup>2</sup>For a married woman is bound by law to her husband while he lives, but if her husband dies she is released from the law of marriage. <sup>3</sup>Accordingly, she will be called an adulteress if she lives with another man while her husband is alive. But if her husband dies, she is free from that law, and if she marries another man she is not an adulteress. <sup>4</sup>Likewise, my brothers, you also have died to the law through the body of Christ, so that you may belong to another, to him who has been raised from the dead, in order that we may bear fruit for God. <sup>5</sup>For while we were living in the flesh, our sinful passions, aroused by the law, were at work in our members to bear fruit for death. <sup>6</sup>But now we are released from the law, having died to that which held us captive, so that we serve in the new way of the Spirit and not in the old way of the written code. What then shall we say? That the law is sin? By no means! Yet if it had not been for the law, I would not have known sin. For I would not have known what it is to covet if the law had not said, "You shall not covet." <sup>8</sup>But sin, seizing an opportunity through the commandment, produced in me all kinds of covetousness. For apart from the law, sin lies dead. <sup>9</sup>I was once alive apart from the law, but when the commandment came, sin came alive and I died. <sup>10</sup> The very commandment that promised life proved to be death to me. <sup>11</sup>For sin, seizing an opportunity through the commandment, deceived me and through it killed me. <sup>12</sup>So the law is holy, and the commandment is holy and righteous and good.

I. By itself, the Law only brings death; we must be freed from its power.

II. In union with Christ's death, we are freed from the Law and raised to Life.

Sermon

God addresses and speaks to us by the reading and preaching of his Word. Both Christians and non-Christians need to hear the good news of salvation and grow in it.

III. Yet the Law is Good, in that it magnifies the sinfulness of sin.

# Questions for Further Reflection:

- 1. How does the marriage reference in verses 2-3 illustrate the principle of verse 1?
- 2. Consider the encouragement of NT scholar Christopher Ash, who writes, "Because this new husband has been raised from the dead, this new marriage will last forever. There is no 'till death do us part".
- 3. Why is Paul's use of the 10th commandment—"Thou shall not covet"—so effective?
- 4. Consider CEB Cranfield's remark, "...while the Law is certainly not sin, it is true that sin has been able to exploit it for its own purpose to deadly effect." How does Genesis 3 show us this?
- 5. Why is the Law's ability to show sin as "utterly sinful" a good thing? Perhaps reflecting on this can help shape the way you pray for and witness to friends/family still under the Law's death grip.

# CELEBRATION OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

The Lord's Supper

The gospel is not only heard, but visibly seen as God invites us to commune with him at his table. In the Lord's Supper we remember and experience Jesus' saving work.

We observe the Lord's Supper each Lord's Day as the climax of our worship service. We invite to the Lord's Table all those who are baptized disciples of Jesus Christ, under the authority of Christ and His body—the Church. Visiting children who have not been examined by their church's leadership, we ask to refrain. By sharing in the Supper, you are acknowledging to our church that you are in covenant with our Triune God through the person and work of Jesus Christ. If you are in doubt about your participation, please refrain. Wine and bread are the elements of the supper as instituted by Jesus Christ. We recommend the use of wine; however we offer both juice and wine in the tray to allow true liberty of conscience.
