COMMON CONFESSION OF SIN SCRIPTURE OF EXHORTATION: 1 John 3:16-18

If anyone has the world's goods and sees his brother in need, yet closes his heart against him, how does God's love abide in him? Little children, let us not love in word or talk but in deed and in truth.

All: Almighty Father, God of gods and Lord of lords, Father to the fatherless, Husband to the widow, Defender of the helpless, Judge of all the earth, have mercy on us. We have not sought freedom for the oppressed, even though you freed us. We have not bound up the broken even though you healed us. We have not forgiven others even though you freely forgave us. We withhold kindness from the needy even though you freely gave us your own son. We are without excuse, but not without hope. Sermon Series—Discipleship Pastor Lloyd Pierson, Ph.D. The Greatest Disciple—Mark 9:33-37, 10:42-48

Mark 9:33-37

³³And they came to Capernaum. And when he was in the house he asked them, "What were you discussing on the way?" ³⁴But they kept silent, for on the way they had argued with one another about who was the greatest. ³⁵And he sat down and called the twelve. And he said to them, "If anyone would be first, he must be last of all and servant of all." ³⁶And he took a child and put him in the midst of them, and taking him in his arms, he said to them, ³⁷"Whoever receives one such child in my name receives me, and whoever receives me, receives not me but him who sent me."

⁴²And Jesus called them to him and said to them, "You know that those who are considered rulers of the Gentiles lord it over them, and their great ones exercise authority over them. ⁴³But it shall not be so among you. Sermon

God addresses and speaks to us by the reading and preaching of his Word. Both Christians and non-Christians need to hear the good news of salvation and grow in it.

Questions for Further Reflection

- 1. What about the disciples' bickering is so predictable about ambition? How have you seen your own life caught up in playing the game of success and ambition?
- 2. In Mark 3:4, the pharisees are silent when Jesus asks them a question, and in Mark 9:34 the disciples are silent at his question. How are the disciples mirroring the pharisees at this point? How are both groups misunderstanding the mission of Jesus in both cases?
- 3. Consider: "To fail in being a servant is not simply to fall short of an ideal condition but to stand outside of an existing condition that corresponds to the kingdom of God." —James Edwards. Jesus gives a radical condition of the kingdom. How is this a part of his "alien" righteousness that must be imputed to us?
- 4. The great Greek philosopher Plato asks: "How can one be happy when he has to serve someone?" How would you answer this question for Plato?
- 5. To look out and away from ourselves is the most God-like action we can do. What makes this so hard? How do we get better at it?

Children's Question

To follow Jesus means that we must serve others like Jesus did. How does Jesus help us to serve others when we don't want to? How do we battle against our desires to put ourselves first?
