Colors in the Church

We use different colored banners in a symbolic way throughout the liturgical year. White = purity & holiness Purple = royalty & suffering. Red = blood & fire Blue = royalty Black = mourning & death (only used on Good Friday) Green = life & growth

Call to Confession We all sin daily, in thought and word and deed. As we come into God's presence, we acknowledge how we have rebelled against our King and seek his forgiveness.

COMMON CONFESSION OF SIN SCRIPTURE OF EXHORTATION: 1 Samuel 15:22-23

Has the LORD as great delight in burnt offerings and sacrifices, as in obeying the voice of the LORD? Behold, to obey is better than sacrifice, and to listen than the fat of rams. For rebellion is as the sin of divination, and presumption is as iniquity and idolatry.

All: Holy Father, you see us as we are, and know our inmost thoughts. We confess that we are unworthy of your gracious care. We forget that all life comes from you and that to you all life returns. Questions for Further Reflection

- 1. In what ways does Psalm 111 help us answer these two questions: How do we know the world around us? & How do we know God himself?
- 2. Consider: "Science doesn't address some of the topics where we most need enlightenment: religion, politics, and morals...A scientist pontificating on matters outside her field is no better than anyone else pontificating on matters outside her field."— Alvin Plantinga. How is this a challenge to you in weighing in on matters outside your own knowledge?
- 3. Knowing God enables us to know the world around us. How does this Psalm highlight the folly of those who would try to know the world apart from knowing God?
- 4. What are some implications of this statement: "When it comes to faith, no sound Christian would really think that the intellectual content of his or her faith is separate from the relational commitment to God." –C. John Collins
- 5. How does the gospel enable us to pursue scientific study with new hope and purpose?
