Sermon Series—Summer Psalms & Proverbs Pastor Lloyd Pierson, Ph.D. Get Wisdom—Proverbs 4:1-9

Proverbs 4:1-9 (NIV)—

¹Listen, my sons, to a father's instruction; pay attention and gain understanding. ²I give you sound learning, so do not forsake my teaching. ³For I too was a son to my father, still tender, and cherished by my mother. ⁴Then he taught me, and he said to me, "Take hold of my words with all your heart; keep my commands, and you will live. ⁵Get wisdom, get understanding; do not forget my words or turn away from them. ⁶Do not forsake wisdom, and she will protect you; love her, and she will watch over you. ⁷The beginning of wisdom is this: Get wisdom. Though it cost all you have, get understanding. ⁸Cherish her, and she will exalt you; embrace her, and she will honor you. ⁹She will give you a garland to grace your head and present you with a glorious crown."

Questions for Further Reflection

- 1. What have you sacrificed in the pursuit of Biblical wisdom? How is the attaining of wisdom similar to exercise and diet in getting a healthy body?
- 2. How have you seen living by God's design as a protection for your life? What have been obstacles to this in your own life?
- 3. Consider: "Every time you make a choice, you are turning the central part of you that chooses into something a little different than it was before" C.J. Collin. What is both exciting and terrifying about this remark?
- 4. Proverbs addresses the whole man. According to Dereck Kidner, you must be able to think clearly, to manage your affairs, to be sensitive to people, to be morally upright, and most of all to be connected to God.
- 5. Consider: "Wisdom is not inert knowledge. You could memorize the book of Proverbs and not have wisdom."—M. Fox. Wisdom is relational. You must be connected to the Lord in order to live wisely in the world God has made. How does Christ's Lordship rule your life and align you with his wisdom?

The Lord's Supper

The gospel is not only heard, but visibly seen as God invites us to commune with him at his table. In the Lord's Supper we remember and experience Jesus' saving work.

> We observe the Lord's Supper each Lord's Day as the climax of our worship service. We invite to the Lord's Table all those who are baptized disciples of Jesus Christ, under the authority of Christ and His body—the Church. Visiting children who have not been examined by their church's leadership, we ask to refrain. By sharing in the Supper, you are acknowledging to our church that you are in covenant with our Triune God through the person and work of Jesus Christ. If you are in doubt about your participation, please refrain. Wine and bread are the elements of the supper as instituted by Jesus Christ. We recommend the use of wine; however we offer both juice and wine in the tray to allow true liberty of conscience.
