Sermon Series—Summer Psalms & Proverbs Pastor John Sackett Comfort, Confidence, Praise—Psalm 57

¹Be merciful to me, O God, be merciful to me, for in you my soul takes refuge; in the shadow of your wings I will take refuge, till the storms of destruction pass by. ²I cry out to God Most High, to God who fulfills his purpose for me. ³He will send from heaven and save me; he will put to shame him who tramples on me. *Selah* God will send out his steadfast love and his faithfulness! ⁴My soul is in the midst of lions; I lie down amid fiery beasts—the children of man, whose teeth are spears and arrows, whose tongues are sharp swords. ⁵Be exalted, O God, above the heavens! Let your glory be over all the earth! ⁶They set a net for my steps; my soul was bowed down. They dug a pit in my way, but they have fallen into it themselves. *Selah* ⁷My heart is steadfast, O God, my heart is steadfast! I will sing and make melody! ⁸Awake, my glory! Awake, O harp and lyre! I will awake the dawn! ⁹I will give thanks to you, O Lord, among the peoples; I will sing praises to you among the nations. ¹⁰For your steadfast love is great to the heavens, your faithfulness to the clouds. ¹¹Be exalted, O God, above the heavens! Let your glory be over all the earth!

Sermon

God addresses and speaks to us by the reading and preaching of his Word. Both Christians and non-Christians need to hear the good news of salvation and grow in it.

Questions for Further Reflection

- 1. This Psalm begins with a double call for mercy from God, as well as the beautiful imagery of taking shelter under God's wings. James May writes of this vision of God that "permeates the prayer and diminishes the reality of danger." Does your view of God provide this kind of confidence and comfort?
- 2. How significant is the phrase in verse 2 "...[He] fulfills His purpose for me"? Consider the theological/doctrinal truth here, and whether you need to strengthen your belief or understanding.
- 3. In verse 3, we get the picture that God sends us two emissaries, "Loyal Love and Truth (or Faithfulness)" to care for us, and guide us through the night (verse 4) with the lions. Why do these ambassadors so faithfully represent God? Why do they (love and truth) need to be kept together?
- 4. How does this Psalm beautifully weave the theological truths of God's immanence and His transcendence? How does this Psalm encourage missions?
- 5. Several commentators noted that Psalm 57 is regularly used on Easter Sunday. Why might this be appropriate?

Children's Question

Have you ever seen a bird stretch out its wings to protect its young? How can we stay close to God to enjoy that protection from Him?

*GOD, BE MERCIFUL TO ME

God, be merciful to me; on Thy grace I rest my plea Plenteous in compassion Thou, blot out my transgressions now; Wash me, make me pure within; cleanse, O cleanse me from my sin.

My transgressions I confess; grief and guilt my soul oppress. I have sinned against Thy grace, and provoked Thee to Thy face. I confess Thy judgment just; speechless, I Thy mercy trust.

Broken, humbled to the dust, by Thy wrath and judgment just, Let my contrite heart rejoice, and in gladness hear Thy voice; From my sins O hide Thy face, blot them out in boundless grace.

Gracious God, my heart renew, make my spirit right and true. Cast me not away from Thee, let Thy Spirit dwell in me; Thy salvation's joy impart, steadfast make my willing heart.

Sinners then shall learn from me, and return O God to Thee. Savior all my guilt remove, and my tongue shall sing Thy love; Touch my silent lips O Lord, and my mouth shall praise accord.

The Lord's Supper

The gospel is not only heard, but visibly seen as God invites us to commune with him at his table. In the Lord's Supper we remember and experience Jesus' saving work.

*THE GREAT THANKSGIVING

Leader: The Lord be with you.

All: And also with you. Leader: Lift up your hearts.

CELEBRATION OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

Wine is located in the two outer rings; juice is located in the center ring. (See FCC observance on below)

We observe the Lord's Supper each Lord's Day as the climax of our worship service. We invite to the Lord's Table all those who are baptized disciples of Jesus Christ, under the authority of Christ and His body—the Church. Visiting children who have not been examined by their church's leadership, we ask to refrain. By sharing in the Supper, you are acknowledging to our church that you are in covenant with our Triune God through the person and work of Jesus Christ. If you are in doubt about your participation, please refrain. Wine and bread are the elements of the supper as instituted by Jesus Christ. We recommend the use of wine; however we offer both juice and wine in the tray to allow true liberty of conscience.
