Questions for Further Reflection

- 1. In Scripture, we see people being told no even for doing good things. King David was told no in his desire to build the temple (1 Chronicles 28:3). The Apostle Paul was told no in his desire to go to Bithynia (Acts 16:7). These men submitted to the Lord's direction. How is seeing good and right desires being told no instructive for us?
- 2. In Numbers 22:12, God clearly tells Balaam not to go with the men of Moab. He asks three times and then it seems that God allows him to go, but he is almost struck down by an angel. Even after this Balaam still proceeds. What can we learn from this?
- 3. What if we are sure that what the Lord is telling us is the right thing to do but others tell us no? How should we respond? What are some wise steps in this process?
- 4. Why is it that we do not tend to doubt our own hearts and motives even when we fully know that we are sinners and we doubt the hearts and motives of others?
- 5. The initial no is sometimes easy to hear, but then it starts to gnaw at us and resentment grows. What are some wise steps to help avoid this?
- 6. How we deal with the No's of life show us most clearly our own submission to Christ. How are you currently doing with your God given No's?

Children's Question

When we are told "no" by our parents, we often complain and get upset. How does my relationship with Jesus help to respond differently? How can I grow in my faith and character during these times?
