Sermon Series—Summer Psalms & Proverbs Youth & Family Pastor Jake Neufeld From Generation to Generation—Psalm 78:1-8

¹Give ear, O my people, to my teaching; incline your ears to the words of my mouth! ²I will open my mouth in a parable; I will utter dark sayings from of old, ³things that we have heard and known, that our fathers have told us. ⁴We will not hide them from their children, but tell to the coming generation the glorious deeds of the Lord, and his might, and the wonders that he has done. ⁵He established a testimony in Jacob and appointed a law in Israel, which he commanded our fathers to teach to their children, ⁵that the next generation might know them, the children yet unborn, and arise and tell them to their children, ⁵so that they should set their hope in God and not forget the works of God, but keep his commandments; ³and that they should not be like their fathers, a stubborn and rebellious generation, a generation whose heart was not steadfast, whose spirit was not faithful to God.

I. Youth, incline your ears to listen.

II. Adults, tell of what you've heard.

III. The Lord is redeeming an inter-generational people.

Sermon

God addresses and speaks to us by the reading and preaching of his Word. Both Christians and non-Christians need to hear the good news of salvation and grow in it.

Questions for Further Reflection

- 1. What are some ways that you see a breakdown between the generations in our culture? In the church? Family?
- 2. Youth: what are three practical ways that you can improve in 'inclining your ears' to your elders?
- 3. Adults: what are three practical ways that you can get involved with youth in order to pass on what you've seen and heard?
- 4. Parents: in what ways have you succeeded and in what ways have you failed to transmit the faith to your children? How can you take the initiative to seek them out now?
- 5. Charles Spurgeon said, "Those who forget God's works are sure to fail in their own." In light of our sermon series on wisdom, why do we fail when we forget God's work? Can you think of a personal example when you've failed because God was an afterthought.
- 6. Who's the hero of the stories we tell? How can we do a better job of pointing to God in the stories we tell about ourselves?

Children's Question

Children, you are called to 'incline your ears' to God's teaching; that is, you are supposed to listen, submit, and do what it says. How can you show your parents or teachers that you value what they are saying more than what you have to say?

The Lord's Supper

The gospel is not only heard, but visibly seen as God invites us to commune with him at his table. In the Lord's Supper we remember and experience Jesus' saving work.

CELEBRATION OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

Wine is located in the two outer rings; juice is located in the center ring. (See FCC observance on below)

We observe the Lord's Supper each Lord's Day as the climax of our worship service. We invite to the Lord's Table all those who are baptized disciples of Jesus Christ, under the authority of Christ and His body—the Church. Visiting children who have not been examined by their church's leadership, we ask to refrain. By sharing in the Supper, you are acknowledging to our church that you are in covenant with our Triune God through the person and work of Jesus Christ. If you are in doubt about your participation, please refrain. Wine and bread are the elements of the supper as instituted by Jesus Christ. We recommend the use of wine; however we offer both juice and wine in the tray to allow true liberty of conscience.
