COMMON CONFESSION OF SIN SCRIPTURE OF EXHORTATION: Isaiah 29:13-14

Sermon Series—Summer Psalms & Proverbs Pastor Lloyd Pierson, Ph.D. Where Your Heart Is—Proverbs 4:20-27

Proverbs 4:20-27 (NIV):

²⁰My son, pay attention to what I say; turn your ear to my words. ²¹Do not let them out of your sight, keep them within your heart; ²²for they are life to those who find them and health to one's whole body. ²³Above all else, guard your heart, for everything you do flows from it. ²⁴Keep your mouth free of perversity; keep corrupt talk far from your lips. ²⁵Let your eyes look straight ahead; fix your gaze directly before you. ²⁶Give careful thought to the paths for your feet and be steadfast in all your ways. ²⁷Do not turn to the right or the left; keep your foot from evil.

Questions for Further Reflection

- 1. In the Bible, the word "heart" speaks to our whole inner person—our minds, will, and emotions. How does our contemporary culture use the word "heart"? Why do we need to always keep this in mind when we see the word 'heart' in the Bible?
- 2. Wisdom is skill in the art of godly living. Keeping our heart is essential to cultivating that skill. How does Matthew 6:19-21 instruct us in matters of the heart?
- 3. Mark 7:6 "Well did Isaiah prophesy of you hypocrites, as it is written, 'This people honors me with their lips, but their heart is far from me." (See Isaiah 29:13) Jesus condemns going through religious motions while the heart is disengaged. The answer is not to get rid of the motions, but to change the heart. Why are we to connect both the inner motivation and the outer actions together?
- 4. Consider: "God is the highest good of the reasonable creature; and the enjoyment of him is the only happiness with which our souls can be satisfied...Fathers and mothers, husbands, wives or children, or the company of friends are but shadows; but the enjoyment of God is the substance. These are but scattered beams; but God is the sun. These are but streams; but God is the ocean...Why should we labor for, or set our hearts on anything else but that which is our proper end and true happiness?" –Jonathan Edwards. How is this a challenge for you? In what way does your desire for God regularly move your heart?
- 5. For a Christian, what does it mean for us to attend to our hearts? How can a person train or exercise his/her heart? How does the good news of Jesus transform our hearts?

How are you able to guard your heart? How does Jesus guide your life?

The Lord's Supper

The gospel is not only heard, but visibly seen as God invites us to commune with him at his table. In the Lord's Supper we remember and experience Jesus' saving work.

CELEBRATION OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

Wine is located in the two outer rings; juice is located in the center ring. (See FCC observance on below)

We observe the Lord's Supper each Lord's Day as the climax of our worship service. We invite to the Lord's Table all those who are baptized disciples of Jesus Christ, under the authority of Christ and His body—the Church. Visiting children who have not been examined by their church's leadership, we ask to refrain. By sharing in the Supper, you are acknowledging to our church that you are in covenant with our Triune God through the person and work of Jesus Christ. If you are in doubt about your participation, please refrain. Wine and bread are the elements of the supper as instituted by Jesus Christ. We recommend the use of wine; however we offer both juice and wine in the tray to allow true liberty of conscience.
