We use different colored banners in a symbolic way throughout the liturgical year. White = purity & holiness Purple = royalty & suffering. Red = blood & fire Blue = royalty Black = mourning & death (only used on Good Friday) Green = life & growth

Sermon Series—God's Generational Faithfulness Pastor John Sackett The Wages of Sin is Death—Genesis 4:1-16

¹Now Adam knew Eve his wife, and she conceived and bore Cain, saying, "I have gotten a man with the help of the Lord." ²And again, she bore his brother Abel. Now Abel was a keeper of sheep, and Cain a worker of the ground. ³In the course of time Cain brought to the Lord an offering of the fruit of the ground, ⁴and Abel also brought of the firstborn of his flock and of their fat portions. And the Lord had regard for Abel and his offering, ⁵but for Cain and his offering he had no regard. So Cain was very angry, and his face fell. ⁶The Lord said to Cain, "Why are you angry, and why has your face fallen? ⁷If you do well, will you not be accepted? And if you do not do well, sin is crouching at the door. Its desire is for you, and you must rule over it." 8Cain spoke to Abel his brother. And when they were in the field, Cain rose up against his brother Abel and killed him. ⁹Then the Lord said to Cain, "Where is Abel your brother?" He said, "I do not know; am I my brother's keeper?" 10 And the Lord said, "What have you done? The voice of your brother's blood is crying to me from the ground. ¹¹And now you are cursed from the ground, which has opened its mouth to receive your brother's blood from your hand. 12When you work the ground, it shall no longer yield to you its strength. You shall be a fugitive and a wanderer on the earth." ¹³Cain said to the Lord, "My punishment is greater than I can bear. 14 Behold, you have driven me today away from the ground, and from your face I shall be hidden. I shall be a fugitive and a wanderer on the earth, and whoever finds me will kill me." ¹⁵Then the Lord said to him, "Not so! If anyone kills Cain, vengeance shall be taken on him sevenfold." And the Lord put a mark on Cain, lest any who found him should attack him. ¹⁶Then Cain went away from the presence of the Lord and settled in the land of Nod, east of Eden.

While sin and depravity are expanding, God's faithfulness still abounds. He is present, He is powerful, and He is good. He is worthy of our lives lived in worship.

Sermon

God addresses and speaks to us by the reading and preaching of his Word. Both Christians and non-Christians need to hear the good news of salvation and grow in it.

Questions for Further Reflection

- 1. The first 4 verses seem to present a healthy growth in the family—children are born, gainfully working, and now bringing an offering to the Lord. Then verse 5 shows something is very wrong. What do verses 5 -7 teach us about God and about man?
- 2. Consider re-reading chapter 3 and looking for similarities in phrasing and ideas. Is there something more to see here than a curiosity?
- 3. Gordon Wenham sees a 5-part drama, opening with Cain approaching God, and ending with Cain departing from God. In the middle section is dialogue, murder, dialogue. This approach might help us to see the clear consequence of our sin. Does the story end with Cain's departure?
- 4. Regarding Cain's mark, Franz Delitzch remarks that God is essentially his protector which is the "utmost Mercy can do for the unrepentant." How do you treat the unrepentant?
- 5. Where is Jesus in this story? Has the promise of Genesis 3:15 developed?
