Colors in the Church

We use different colored banners in a symbolic way throughout the liturgical year. White = purity & holiness Purple = royalty & suffering. Red = blood & fire Blue = royalty Black = mourning & death (only used on Good Friday) Green = life & growth

Sermon Series—God's Generational Faithfulness Pastor Lloyd Pierson, PhD. Father Abraham Had Many Sons—Genesis 16 & 21

Genesis 16:1-6 (ESV)

¹Now Sarai, Abram's wife, had borne him no children. She had a female Egyptian servant whose name was Hagar. ²And Sarai said to Abram, "Behold now, the LORD has prevented me from bearing children. Go in to my servant; it may be that I shall obtain children by her." And Abram listened to the voice of Sarai. ³So, after Abram had lived ten years in the land of Canaan, Sarai, Abram's wife, took Hagar the Egyptian, her servant, and gave her to Abram her husband as a wife. ⁴And he went in to Hagar, and she conceived. And when she saw that she had conceived, she looked with contempt on her mistress. ⁵And Sarai said to Abram, "May the wrong done to me be on you! I gave my servant to your embrace, and when she saw that she had conceived, she looked on me with contempt. May the LORD judge between you and me!" ⁶But Abram said to Sarai, "Behold, your servant is in your power; do to her as you please." Then Sarai dealt harshly with her, and she fled from her.

Genesis 21:1-7 (ESV)

¹The Lord visited Sarah as he had said, and the Lord did to Sarah as he had promised. ²And Sarah conceived and bore Abraham a son in his old age at the time of which God had spoken to him. ³Abraham called the name of his son who was born to him, whom Sarah bore him, Isaac. ⁴And Abraham circumcised his son Isaac when he was eight days old, as God had commanded him. ⁵Abraham was a hundred years old when his son Isaac was born to him. ⁶And Sarah said, "God has made laughter for me; everyone who hears will laugh over me." ⁷And she said, "Who would have said to Abraham that Sarah would nurse children? Yet I have borne him a son in his old age."

Sermon

God addresses and speaks to us by the reading and preaching of his Word. Both Christians and non-Christians need to hear the good news of salvation and grow in it.

Questions for Further Reflection

- 1. In Galatians 4:24, Paul says that Hagar represents slavery under the law and Sarah represents the freedom of God's promise of grace. How does Abraham's life show these two principles at work in his own life? How does God's grace triumph?
- 2. How does the birth of Isaac parallel the birth of Jesus? How are they different?
- 3. Regarding Genesis 22 and the sacrifice of Isaac, one commentator said, "The problem of this narrative is to hold together and embrace both the dark command of God and his high promise." —Walter Brueggemann. How does Jesus connect all the dots?
- 4. Consider: "Stop praying, 'Lord, I want you to make my life better.' Stop praying, 'Lord, I want you to make my husband or wife better. I want my children to behave. I want an ideal job.' When you pray that way, you can only end up frustrated, because God will not subordinate himself to any human agenda. Start praying, 'Lord, I just want you to be God to me. I want my life, with my problems, to show the world that you save sinners." —Ray Ortlund. How does a Christ-centered reality change the way we think and pray?
- 5. God's faithfulness to his promises in Genesis 3:15 and his preservation of Noah and all of mankind in Genesis 6-9 now enter into the life of Abraham. In what way is Abraham's life a microcosm of humanity?

Children's Question

God brings his promises to us by grace and not by our earning his favor. How does this encourage your own faith knowing the Lord is the one who fulfills his promises even though we are unworthy of them?

The Lord's Supper

The gospel is not only heard, but visibly seen as God invites us to commune with him at his table. In the Lord's Supper we remember and experience Jesus' saving work.

CELEBRATION OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

Wine is located in the two outer rings; juice is located in the center ring. (See FCC observance on below)

PRAYER FOR THE CONGREGATION

We observe the Lord's Supper each Lord's Day as the climax of our worship service. We invite to the Lord's Table all those who are baptized disciples of Jesus Christ, under the authority of Christ and His body—the Church. Visiting children who have not been examined by their church's leadership, we ask to refrain. By sharing in the Supper, you are acknowledging to our church that you are in covenant with our Triune God through the person and work of Jesus Christ. If you are in doubt about your participation, please refrain. Wine and bread are the elements of the supper as instituted by Jesus Christ. We recommend the use of wine; however we offer both juice and wine in the tray to allow true liberty of conscience.
