Sermon Series—God's Generational Faithfulness Pastor Lloyd Pierson, Ph.D. If/Then—1 Kings 9:4-9

⁴And as for you, if you will walk before me, as David your father walked, with integrity of heart and uprightness, doing according to all that I have commanded you, and keeping my statutes and my rules, ⁵then I will establish your royal throne over Israel forever, as I promised David your father, saying, 'You shall not lack a man on the throne of Israel.' ⁶But if you turn aside from following me, you or your children, and do not keep my commandments and my statutes that I have set before you, but go and serve other gods and worship them, ⁷then I will cut off Israel from the land that I have given them, and the house that I have consecrated for my name I will cast out of my sight, and Israel will become a proverb and a byword among all peoples. ⁸And this house will become a heap of ruins. Everyone passing by it will be astonished and will hiss, and they will say, 'Why has the Lord done thus to this land and to this house?' ⁹Then they will say, 'Because they abandoned the Lord their God who brought their fathers out of the land of Egypt and laid hold on other gods and worshiped them and served them. Therefore the Lord has brought all this disaster on them.'

Questions for Further Reflection

- 1. How did God's promises to David differ from his promises to Solomon? What are the differences between a conditional and an unconditional covenant in the Bible?
- 2. How does the book of Kings answer this question: "If the God of Moses did exist, and was good and all-powerful, how was it that God's chosen city and temple had been destroyed, and how was it that God's chosen line of David had all but come to its end?"
- 3. The words "wisdom" or "wise" occur 21 times in 1 Kings 1-11 (all during the life of Solomon) but nowhere afterwards. How do we see the Law, Wisdom, and the temple fulfilled in Jesus? (Cf. Romans 8:1-4).
- 4. Look at Exodus 19:5, Deuteronomy 30:1, and Psalm 132:12. What role does obedience to the Law have in the life of Israel? How are we to understand these conditions in light of God's unconditional grace?
- 5. The message to Israel is not "straighten up and fly right." The message is Israel must put its hope in the God who will bring new life after death. How does the divided kingdom of Israel anticipate Jesus?
- 6. Why is it a fools' errand to think that we now have finally figured out how to bring God's kingdom on earth in a political form? What does it look like for the citizens of heaven to follow Jesus as we walk the earth?

CELEBRATION OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

Wine is located in the two outer rings; juice is located in the center ring. (See FCC observance on below)

We observe the Lord's Supper each Lord's Day as the climax of our worship service. We invite to the Lord's Table all those who are baptized disciples of Jesus Christ, under the authority of Christ and His body—the Church. Visiting children who have not been examined by their church's leadership, we ask to refrain. By sharing in the Supper, you are acknowledging to our church that you are in covenant with our Triune God through the person and work of Jesus Christ. If you are in doubt about your participation, please refrain. Wine and bread are the elements of the supper as instituted by Jesus Christ. We recommend the use of wine; however we offer both juice and wine in the tray to allow true liberty of conscience.

God Communes with Us

The Lord strengthens and nourishes our faith through a sacramental meal. Through Jesus, communion with God has been reestablished. The covenant has been renewed. The Lord's Supper is the gospel made visible for us and we share in it as the full community of God's

people.
