COMMON CONFESSION OF SIN SCRIPTURE OF EXHORTATION: 1 Samuel 15:22-23

Has the LORD as great delight in burnt offerings and sacrifices, as in obeying the voice of the LORD? Behold, to obey is better than sacrifice, and to listen than the fat of rams. For rebellion is as the sin of divination, and presumption is as iniquity and idolatry.

All: Have mercy on us Lord. We often chose sacrifice over obedience. We presume upon your grace, and delight in our show of faith; yet our hearts can be far from you. Forgive us of our disobedience, when we have chosen to love our sin more than to love you. Forgive us of our rebellion, when we have willingly walked away from your commands, in order to pursue the sins of our flesh. Keep us from self-worship, disguised as true religion. Purify and cleanse us by the blood of our Savior, Jesus. Amen.

SILENT CONFESSION OF SIN

DECLARATION OF GRACE: Hebrews 9:13-14

Under the old system, the blood of goats and bulls and the ashes of a heifer could cleanse people's bodies from ceremonial impurity. Just think how much more the blood of Christ will purify our consciences from sinful deeds so that we can worship the living God. For by the power of the eternal Spirit, Christ offered himself to God as a perfect sacrifice for our sins.

Sermon Series—Advent: A New King is Coming Pastor Lloyd Pierson, Ph.D. A New, New Beginning—Isaiah 11:1-5

¹There shall come forth a shoot from the stump of Jesse, and a branch from his roots shall bear fruit. ²And the Spirit of the LORD shall rest upon him, the Spirit of wisdom and understanding, the Spirit of counsel and might, the Spirit of knowledge and the fear of the LORD. ³And his delight shall be in the fear of the LORD. He shall not judge by what his eyes see, or decide disputes by what his ears hear, ⁴but with righteousness he shall judge the poor, and decide with equity for the meek of the earth; and he shall strike the earth with the rod of his mouth, and with the breath of his lips she shall kill the wicked. ⁵Righteousness shall be the belt of his waist, and faithfulness the belt of his loins.

Questions for Further Reflection

- 1. What is significant about the sevenfold elaboration of the Spirit here?
- 2. Jerusalem's destruction is right around the corner from Isaiah's message. How would this be a source of encouragement for those in exile? How might this have been puzzling for those who returned later?
- 3. Read Isaiah 4:2 and 6:13. What kind of picture of future redemption does Isaiah present here with this imagery?
- 4. The coming of Christ fulfills this message in part. What still remains for his second return?
- 5. Through the prophet Isaiah, the Lord comes and says: "The status quo will not get it done." What about Jesus changes not only the status quo but also the expectations of what a kingly Messiah should look like? Why is it that God's people still struggle with what it is to look like through history?
- 6. Knowing that in Christ your failures are not the final word, how are you encouraged in your life of following Jesus?

Children's Question

With Jesus, our failures are never the last word. He can work our worst moments into a trophy of his grace. How does Jesus encourage you when you have failed?

God **Consecrates Us** Consecrate means to make holy, to set apart. The Word of God does that for the lives of believers. Through the sermon, confessions of faith, and the offering we are sanctified for service to our Lord to joyfully offer up our lives to him.

CELEBRATION OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

Wine is located in the two outer rings; juice is located in the center ring.

We observe the Lord's Supper each Lord's Day as the climax of our worship service. We invite to the Lord's Table all those who are baptized disciples of Jesus Christ, under the authority of Christ and His body—the Church. Visiting children who have not been examined by their church's leadership, we ask to refrain. By sharing in the Supper, you are acknowledging to our church that you are in covenant with our Triune God through the person and work of Jesus Christ. If you are in doubt about your participation, please refrain. Wine and bread are the elements of the supper as instituted by Jesus Christ. We recommend the use of wine; however we offer both juice and wine in the tray to allow true liberty of conscience.

God Communes with Us

The Lord strengthens and nourishes our faith through a sacramental meal. Through Jesus, communion with God has been reestablished. The covenant has been renewed. The Lord's Supper is the gospel made visible for us and we share in it as the full community of God's

people.
