

We use different colored banners in a symbolic way throughout the liturgical year. White = purity & holiness Purple = royalty & suffering. Red = blood & fire Blue = royalty Black = mourning & death (only used on Good Friday) Green = life & growth

COMMON CONFESSION OF SIN SCRIPTURE OF EXHORTATION: Psalm 25:8-9, 12-14

Good and upright is the LORD; therefore he instructs sinners in the way. He leads the humble in what is right, and teaches the humble his way. Who is the man who fears the LORD? Him will he instruct in the way that he should choose. His soul shall abide in well-being. The friendship of the LORD is for those who fear him, and he makes known to them his covenant.

Sermon Series—God's Generational Faithfulness Pastor Jake Neufeld "It's Not You It's Me": The Davidic Covenant—2 Samuel 7:1-17

¹Now when the king lived in his house and the Lord had given him rest from all his surrounding enemies, ²the king said to Nathan the prophet, "See now, I dwell in a house of cedar, but the ark of God dwells in a tent." And Nathan said to the king, "Go, do all that is in your heart, for the Lord is with you." ⁴But that same night the word of the Lord came to Nathan, 5"Go and tell my servant David, 'Thus says the Lord: Would you build me a house to dwell in? ⁶I have not lived in a house since the day I brought up the people of Israel from Egypt to this day, but I have been moving about in a tent for my dwelling. In all places where I have moved with all the people of Israel, did I speak a word with any of the judges of Israel, whom I commanded to shepherd my people Israel, saying, "Why have you not built me a house of cedar?" 8Now, therefore, thus you shall say to my servant David, 'Thus says the Lord of hosts, I took you from the pasture, from following the sheep, that you should be prince over my people Israel. ⁹And I have been with you wherever you went and have cut off all your enemies from before you. And I will make for you a great name, like the name of the great ones of the earth. ¹⁰And I will appoint a place for my people Israel and will plant them, so that they may dwell in their own place and be disturbed no more. And violent men shall afflict them no more, as formerly, ¹¹ from the time that I appointed judges over my people Israel. And I will give you rest from all your enemies. Moreover, the Lord declares to you that the Lord will make you a house. 12When your days are fulfilled and you lie down with your fathers, I will raise up your offspring after you, who shall come from your body, and I will establish his kingdom. ¹³He shall build a house for my name, and I will establish the throne of his kingdom forever. ¹⁴I will be to him a father, and he shall be to me a son. When he commits iniquity, I will discipline him with the rod of men, with the stripes of the sons of men, ¹⁵but my steadfast love will not depart from him, as I took it from Saul, whom I put away from before you. ¹⁶And your house and your kingdom shall be made sure forever before me. Your throne shall be established forever." ¹⁷In accordance with all these words, and in accordance with all this vision, Nathan spoke to David.

Sermon

God addresses and speaks to us by the reading and preaching of his Word. Both Christians and non-Christians need to hear the good news of salvation and grow in it.

Questions for Further Reflection

- 1. What great things do you wish you could do for God?
- 2. Godly ambitions like David's are good. How can they also be a problem? Can you think of any examples when godly ambitions have led to negative results/consequences?
- 3. Make a list of all the things that God does for David. Do you think that David, in his own mind, could take credit for those things?
- 4. What's the difference between a 'religious' approach to God versus a 'gospel' approach to God?
- 5. What is the Davidic Covenant? How does the Davidic Covenant build upon the Abrahamic Covenant and the Mosaic Covenant?
- 6. How does the Davidic covenant tie the theme of the covenant [one of the primary Old Testament themes] together with the theme of the kingdom [one of the primary themes of the gospels]?
- 7. What's the difference between a theology of glory and a theology of the cross? How does a theology of the cross in our lives relate to a theology of glory?

Children's Question

What does it mean when God says, "The Lord will make you [King David] a house? God also promises: "I will establish the throne of his kingdom forever." In light of the rest of the Bible, whose eternal throne is God promising?

The Lord's Supper

The gospel is not only heard, but visibly seen as God invites us to commune with him at his table. In the Lord's Supper we remember and experience Jesus' saving work.

CELEBRATION OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

Wine is located in the two outer rings; juice is located in the center ring. (See FCC observance on below)

We observe the Lord's Supper each Lord's Day as the climax of our worship service. We invite to the Lord's Table all those who are baptized disciples of Jesus Christ, under the authority of Christ and His body—the Church. Visiting children who have not been examined by their church's leadership, we ask to refrain. By sharing in the Supper, you are acknowledging to our church that you are in covenant with our Triune God through the person and work of Jesus Christ. If you are in doubt about your participation, please refrain. Wine and bread are the elements of the supper as instituted by Jesus Christ. We recommend the use of wine; however we offer both juice and wine in the tray to allow true liberty of conscience.
