#### LIGHTING OF THE ADVENT CANDLE

# Sermon Series—Advent: A New King is Coming Pastor Lloyd Pierson, Ph.D. Anger Turned Away—Isaiah 12:1-3

<sup>1</sup>You will say in that day: "I will give thanks to you, O LORD, for though you were angry with me, your anger turned away, that you might comfort me. <sup>2</sup> Behold, God is my salvation; I will trust, and will not be afraid; for the LORD GOD is my strength and my song, and he has become my salvation." <sup>3</sup>With joy you will draw water from the wells of salvation.

# Questions for Further Reflection

- 1. Chapter 11 of Isaiah speaks of the kingdom of the Messiah. Chapter 12 is the conclusion of both that theme and the theme of the first 12 chapters. The Messiah of chapter 11 is the Lord himself in chapter 12. How does that instruct us as we celebrate Christ's advent?
- 2. Consider: "Verse 2 celebrates a glorious paradox: the angry God is finally the only source of comfort...In the end, 'comfort' (salvation) can be found only by fleeing into the arms of the righteous God whose wrath we have incurred." –Barry Webb. How does this prepare us for the suffering servant in Isaiah 53?
- 3. As God's people, finding delight and joy in Him is a command. So much so, that we find God's judgment on Israel for failing to do this. (Deuteronomy 28:47 *Because you did not serve the LORD your God with joyfulness and gladness of heart*) Why is joy so integral to our faith?
- 4. Verse 2 is nearly identical to Exodus 15:2, and verse 5 echoes Exodus 15:21. Each are songs after a deliverance of the Lord. How is this instructive for us?
- 5. In what way is repentance the foundation for our joy? How does repentance fuel our hearts with praise?

## Children's Question

Praise and thanksgiving are essential parts of our life of faith. How does Jesus encourage a thankful heart in you?

#### Sermon

God addresses and speaks to us by the reading and preaching of his Word. Both Christians and non-Christians need to hear the good news of salvation and grow in it.

# The Lord's Supper

The gospel is not only heard, but visibly seen as God invites us to commune with him at his table. In the Lord's Supper we remember and experience Jesus' saving work.

## CELEBRATION OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

Wine is located in the two outer rings; juice is located in the center ring. (See FCC observance below)

### PRAYER FOR THE CONGREGATION

We observe the Lord's Supper each Lord's Day as the climax of our worship service. We invite to the Lord's Table all those who are baptized disciples of Jesus Christ, under the authority of Christ and His body—the Church. Visiting children who have not been examined by their church's leadership, we ask to refrain. By sharing in the Supper, you are acknowledging to our church that you are in covenant with our Triune God through the person and work of Jesus Christ. If you are in doubt about your participation, please refrain. Wine and bread are the elements of the supper as instituted by Jesus Christ. We recommend the use of wine; however we offer both juice and wine in the tray to allow true liberty of conscience.

#### \*KING OF KINGS

In the darkness we were waiting, without hope without light Till from Heaven You came running, there was mercy in Your eyes To fulfill the law and prophets, to a virgin came the Word From a throne of endless glory, to a cradle in the dirt
