Jesus' Early Years: Real Growth—Luke 2:39-52 Pastor John Sackett

³⁹And when they had performed everything according to the Law of the Lord, they returned into Galilee, to their own town of Nazareth. ⁴⁰And the child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom. And the favor of God was upon him. ⁴¹Now his parents went to Jerusalem every year at the Feast of the Passover. ⁴² And when he was twelve years old, they went up according to custom. ⁴³ And when the feast was ended, as they were returning, the boy Jesus stayed behind in Jerusalem. His parents did not know it, 44but supposing him to be in the group they went a day's journey, but then they began to search for him among their relatives and acquaintances, ⁴⁵ and when they did not find him, they returned to Jerusalem, searching for him. ⁴⁶ After three days they found him in the temple, sitting among the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions. ⁴⁷And all who heard him were amazed at his understanding and his answers. ⁴⁸And when his parents saw him, they were astonished. And his mother said to him, "Son, why have you treated us so? Behold, your father and I have been searching for you in great distress." ⁴⁹And he said to them, "Why were you looking for me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?" ⁵⁰And they did not understand the saying that he spoke to them. ⁵¹And he went down with them and came to Nazareth and was submissive to them. And his mother treasured up all these things in her heart. 52 And Jesus increased in wisdom and in stature and in favor with God and man.

In order to grow, both Jesus and his parents had to show intentionality.

Growth comes from...

I. Observing wise customs and laws

II. Investigating God's word and will

Sermon

God addresses and speaks to us by the reading and preaching of his Word. Both Christians and non-Christians need to hear the good news of salvation and grow in it.

III. Submission to God-given structures and authority

Questions for Further Reflection

- 1. In all the Gospels, this pericope is the only insight into Jesus' young adult years. Why do you suppose Luke thought it so significant as to include it?
- 2. What is the focal, or central, point of this story?
- 3. Luke gives us a picture of Mary and Joseph's parenting, both their piety, as well as some of their common fears. How can this be an encouragement to our own interactions with friends and family?
- 4. The first words of Jesus are considered, by some, as a mild rebuke to Mary his mother. Since we know that Jesus never sinned, what does this tell us about Jesus' priorities, and how can this inform our own relationship and interactions with friends and family?
- 5. How does Godly submission foster growth? How are you doing with submitting to these God given structures?

Children's Question

This is a short but important story which tells us a lot about Jesus. Is there one short story that summarizes your life and shows your priorities?

*IN CHRIST ALONE

In Christ alone my hope is found, he is my light, my strength, my song;

No guilt in life, no fear in death, this is the pow'r of Christ in me; From life's first cry to final breath, Jesus commands my destiny. No pow'r of hell, no scheme of man, can ever pluck me from his hand. Till he returns or calls me home, here in the pow'r of Christ I'll stand.

The Lord's Supper

The gospel is not only heard, but visibly seen as God invites us to commune with him at his table. In the Lord's Supper we remember and experience Jesus' saving work.

CELEBRATION OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

Wine is located in the two outer rings; juice is located in the center ring. (See FCC observance below)

PRAYER FOR THE CONGREGATION

We observe the Lord's Supper each Lord's Day as the climax of our worship service. We invite to the Lord's Table all those who are baptized disciples of Jesus Christ, under the authority of Christ and His body—the Church. Visiting children who have not been examined by their church's leadership, we ask to refrain. By sharing in the Supper, you are acknowledging to our church that you are in covenant with our Triune God through the person and work of Jesus Christ. If you are in doubt about your participation, please refrain. Wine and bread are the elements of the supper as instituted by Jesus Christ. We recommend the use of wine; however we offer both juice and wine in the tray to allow true liberty of conscience.
