COMMON CONFESSION OF SIN

SCRIPTURE OF EXHORTATION: *2 John 1:6, 8-9*

And this is love, that we walk according to his commandments...

Watch yourselves, so that you may not lose what we have worked for but may win a full reward. Everyone who goes on ahead and does not abide in the teaching of Christ does not have God. Whoever abides in the teaching has both the Father and the Son.

All: Our soul is like a house, small for you to enter, but we pray that you will enlarge it. It is in ruins, but we ask you to remake it. It contains much that you will not be pleased to see; this we know and do not hide. But to whom can we cry except to you? Cleanse us from our sins, O Lord, and our secret sins. What wretches we are! DECLARATION OF GRACE: *Colossians 1:13-14*

*CONFESSİON OF CHRIST'S GRACE (*Heidelberg Catechism #1*) :

The Revelation of Jesus Christ—Revelation 1:1-8

¹The revelation of Jesus Christ, which God gave him to show to his servants the things that must soon take place. He made it known by sending his angel to his servant John, ²who bore witness to the word of God and to the testimony of Jesus Christ, even to all that he saw. ³Blessed is the one who reads aloud the words of this prophecy, and blessed are those who hear, and who keep what is written in it, for the time is near. ⁴John to the seven churches that are in Asia: Grace to you and peace from him who is and who was and who is to come, and from the seven spirits who are before his throne, ⁵and from Jesus Christ the faithful witness, the firstborn of the dead, and the ruler of kings on earth. Questions for Further Reflection

1. Consider: “And in the book entitled the Apocalypse there are, to be sure, many obscure sayings, to exercise the mind of the reader; and there are a few so clear enough to throw light on the meaning of others, even at the cost of effort.”—Augustine. From the beginning, Revelation has challenged and encouraged God’s people. How has the book challenged you to “exercise” your mind?
2. What are some of the unique challenges of understanding symbolism for our time? How is Revelation “resistant to the way of regular interpretation as applied to other books?”—Moses Stuart, 1845.
3. So often, fear and anger have been the result of disagreements on how to understand Revelation. How is it that joy and anticipation get lost so easily in the conversation? What encouragements could you give yourself or someone else stuck in disagreement?
4. There are four main approaches to interpreting Revelation that will set the direction before a page is read. How can you posture yourself to receive insight from these positions even if some of them might not be yours?
5. Jesus takes the center stage from the beginning of the book. He is the beginning and the goal of all history. How does his good news strengthen your resolve when facing uncertainty?

Sermon

God addresses and speaks to us by the reading and preaching of his Word. Both Christians and non-Christians need to hear the good news of salvation and grow in it.

Children’s Question

People always wish they could know what is going to happen in the future. How does knowing that Jesus has won, is winning, and will win encourage you when you feel like you’re losing?

CELEBRATION OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

*Wine is located in the two outer rings; juice is located in the center ring.
(See FCC observance below)*

We observe the Lord's Supper each Lord's Day as the climax of our worship service. We invite to the Lord's Table all those who are baptized disciples of Jesus Christ, under the authority of Christ and His body—the Church. Visiting children who have not been examined by their church's leadership, we ask to refrain. By sharing in the Supper, you are acknowledging to our church that you are in covenant with our Triune God through the person and work of Jesus Christ. If you are in doubt about your participation, please refrain. Wine and bread are the elements of the supper as instituted by Jesus Christ. We recommend the use of wine; however we offer both juice and wine in the tray to allow true liberty of conscience.
