SERMON TEXT: John 12:12-23 (ESV)

12 The next day the large crowd that had come to the feast heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem. 13 So they took branches of palm trees and went out to meet him, crying out, "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord, even the King of Israel!" 14 And Jesus found a young donkey and sat on it, just as it is written, 15 "Fear not, daughter of Zion; behold, your king is coming, sitting on a donkey's colt!" ¹⁶ His disciples did not understand these things at first, but when Jesus was glorified, then they remembered that these things had been written about him and had been done to him. 17 The crowd that had been with him when he called Lazarus out of the tomb and raised him from the dead continued to bear witness. 18 The reason why the crowd went to meet him was that they heard he had done this sign. 19 So the Pharisees said to one another, "You see that you are gaining nothing. Look, the world has gone after him." 20 Now among those who went up to worship at the feast were some Greeks. 21 So these came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida in Galilee, and asked him, "Sir, we wish to see Jesus." 22 Philip went and told Andrew; Andrew and Philip went and told Jesus. 23 And Jesus answered them, "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. ²⁴ Truly, truly, I say to you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains alone; but if it dies, it bears much fruit. ²⁵ Whoever loves his life loses it, and whoever hates his life in this world will keep it for eternal life. ²⁶ If anyone serves me, he must follow me; and where I am, there will my servant be also. If anyone serves me, the Father will honor him.

Questions and thoughts for discussion:

- 1. What role did raising Lazarus from the dead have in Jesus' entry?
- 2. What message is given by Jesus coming into the city on a donkey? Did the people get it?
- 3. Speaking of Jesus as God, Augustine says of this text: "He does not lose his divinity when he teaches us humility." In what way is the glory of God revealed in Jesus' humble entrance into Jerusalem?
- 4. Another early church writer acknowledges the divinity of Jesus taught in this text. "Only God has the power to save, and to Jesus they cry out 'Save us O Lord our God (Ps 105:45). Many other passages in Scripture ascribe to God alone the power to save. The Psalms of David most clearly refer to the Christ as true God."—Theophylact.
- 5. Far from hindering Gentiles from coming to Jesus, his death would draw even greater numbers. How is this possible?
- 6. What does Jesus mean that his hour had come?
- 7. Why is it mentioned that the disciples did not understand? How is this instructive for us.
- 8. What does this passage teach us about the nature of God's glory?
