I. Raised above all

SERMON TEXT: Ephesians 1:19-23 (NIV)

19 That power is the same as the mighty strength 20 he exerted when he raised Christ from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly realms, 21 far above all rule and authority, power and dominion, and every name that is invoked, not only in the present age but also in the one to come. 22 And God placed all things under his feet and appointed him to be head over everything for the church, 23 which is his body, the fullness of him who fills everything in every way.

Questions and thoughts for discussion:

- 1. How does the resurrection of Jesus directly challenge the world's value system? In what way has the reality of what is to come been eclipsed by Christians focusing on the blessings of this life now?
- 2. Consider: "Our society does not fear spiritual forces or blame them for things that go wrong; rather, it looks to them for assistance and good luck." –Klyne Snodgrass, NT scholar
- 3. The seeming paradox of Christ's power arises from his laying his life down for others. Christ's power is most manifest in serving others and entrusting himself to the Father. How does that both instruct us and challenge us?
- 4. What happens when Christians focus on the wrong concept of power? In regards to looking for extrabiblical information about 'powers' how does 1 Cor 4:6 "Do not go beyond what is written." and Deut 29:29 instruct us?
- 5. What is meant by 'fullness'? What role does the Church have in God's display of Christ's power?
- 6. In what way does Paul demonstrate the "here but not yet" aspect of the gospel?
