SERMON TEXT: 1Kings 11:29-39; 12:26-33 (ESV) 1KINGS 11:29-39

²⁹ And at that time, when Jeroboam went out of Jerusalem, the prophet Ahijah the Shilonite found him on the road...And he said to Jeroboam...for thus says the LORD, the God of Israel, 'Behold, I am about to tear the kingdom from the hand of Solomon and will give you ten tribes 32 (but he shall have one tribe, for the sake of my servant David and for the sake of Jerusalem, the city that I have chosen out of all the tribes of Israel), 33 because they have forsaken me and worshiped Ashtoreth the goddess of the Sidonians, Chemosh the god of Moab, and Milcom the god of the Ammonites, and they have not walked in my ways, doing what is right in my sight and keeping my statutes and my rules, as David his father did... 37 And I will take you, and you shall reign over all that your soul desires, and you shall be king over Israel. 38 And if you will listen to all that I command you, and will walk in my ways, and do what is right in my eyes by keeping my statutes and my commandments, as David my servant did, I will be with you and will build you a sure house, as I built for David, and I will give Israel to you. 39 And I will afflict the offspring of David because of this, but not forever."

1 KINGS 12:26-33

²⁶ And Jeroboam said in his heart, "Now the kingdom will turn back to the house of David. ²⁷ If this people go up to offer sacrifices in the temple of the LORD at Jerusalem, then the heart of this people will turn again to their lord, to Rehoboam king of Judah, and they will kill me and return to Rehoboam king of Judah." ²⁸ So the king took counsel and made two calves of gold. And he said to the people, "You have gone up to Jerusalem long enough. Behold your gods, O Israel, who brought you up out of the land of Egypt." 29 And he set one in Bethel, and the other he put in Dan. 30 Then this thing became a sin, for the people went as far as Dan to be before one. 31 He also made temples on high places and appointed priests from among all the people, who were not of the Levites. 32 And Jeroboam appointed a feast on the fifteenth day of the eighth month like the feast that was in Judah, and he offered sacrifices on the altar. So he did in Bethel, sacrificing to the calves that he made. And he placed in Bethel the priests of the high places that he had made. ³³ He went up to the altar that he had made in Bethel on the fifteenth day in the eighth month, in the month that he had devised from his own heart. And he instituted a feast for the people of Israel and went up to the altar to make offerings.

Questions and thoughts for discussion:

- 1. What does it mean to call the Book of Kings a 'theological history'?
- 2. Consider: "As a prophetic narrative, 1–2 Kings makes it clear that there is no salvation for Israel from within Israel." –Peter Leithart
- 3. The Lord's great patience is on display throughout the Book of Kings. He seems to wait for a long time before he punishes any of the wicked kings. What does this tell us about the character of God?
- 4. Jeroboam's sin will be referenced about 60 times in the Book of Kings. It is a central theme to God's rebuke of the northern tribe of Israel. What about Jeroboam's sin makes sense from a political standpoint?
- 5. What is significant about the cities of Dan and Bethel that the golden calves are set up there?
- 6. What are some significant points we learn about the nature of true worship from Jeroboam's sin? In what way does much of American Christianity struggle with these same issues?
- 7. God's promise to David has not been undone. In what way do we see the Lord's faithfulness on display through this first wicked king of Israel?
