

Sermon: Pastor Lloyd Pierson, Ph.D. Sermon Series: Tales from the North Sermon Title: *Omri–A Story of Success* Sermon Text: 1 Kings 16:23-28

I. Success-crushing our enemies one king at a time

II. Success-showing faithfulness to the Lord one decision at a time

SERMON TEXT: 1Kings 16:23-28 (ESV)

²³ In the thirty-first year of Asa king of Judah, Omri began to reign over Israel, and he reigned for twelve years; six years he reigned in Tirzah. ²⁴ He bought the hill of Samaria from Shemer for two talents of silver, and he fortified the hill and called the name of the city that he built Samaria, after the name of Shemer, the owner of the hill. ²⁵ Omri did what was evil in the sight of the LORD, and did more evil than all who were before him. ²⁶ For he walked in all the way of Jeroboam the son of Nebat, and in the sins that he made Israel to sin, provoking the LORD, the God of Israel, to anger by their idols. ²⁷ Now the rest of the acts of Omri that he did, and the might that he showed, are they not written in the Book of the Chronicles of the Kings of Israel? ²⁸ And Omri slept with his fathers and was buried in Samaria, and Ahab his son reigned in his place.

Questions and thoughts for discussion:

- 1. What do we learn about Omri from the archeological discoveries of the Black Obelisk of Shalmaneser III, the Moabite Mesha stele, and the inscriptions of Tiglath-pileser III?
- 2. In what ways do Omri's life parallel King David's? How are they different?
- 3. What was the advantage of having Samaria as the new capital?
- 4. What does it mean to say that all power is derivative?
- 5. Consider: "It requires faith to believe that the Lord's warnings of judgment will not fail to come to pass when nothing happens for years, even centuries, on end."—Dr. Rayburn
- 6. Why is it important to understand the theological evaluation of Omri from the Lord's perspective?
- 7. In what ways do Christians still struggle with evaluating 'success'? How does our faithfulness to the Lord play into our evaluation?
- 8. At the end of Jesus' life, how would his 'success' be evaluated by the standards of the world?
- 9. What about the gospel completely undoes the world's accounting system?
