PROVERBS 10:19-21

¹⁹ When words are many, transgression is not lacking, but whoever restrains his lips is prudent. ²⁰ The tongue of the righteous is choice silver; the heart of the wicked is of little worth. ²¹ The lips of the righteous feed many, but fools die for lack of sense.

PROVERBS 18:20-21

²⁰ From the fruit of a man's mouth his stomach is satisfied; he is satisfied by the yield of his lips. ²¹ Death and life are in the power of the tongue, and those who love it will eat its fruits.

PROVERBS 10:31-32

³¹ The mouth of the righteous brings forth wisdom, but the perverse tongue will be cut off. ³² The lips of the righteous know what is acceptable, but the mouth of the wicked, what is perverse.

- 1. Consider: "Words do not come from nowhere. Out of his bounty, his goodness, God has supplied human beings with all the words in each particular language." -Prof. Vern Poythress
- 2. MIT professor, Noam Chomsky, explaining his theory of Universal Grammar, says that the human ability to know languages is hard-wired into the brain.
- 3. How is our speech an index of our character?
- 4. Why is guarding our tongue also a major step in guarding our hearts?
- 5. If you are one who is given to speaking more and listening less, what are some helpful ways to correct this?
- 6. Jesus is the Word made flesh. How does this inform our own communication? What does it mean to speak redemptively?
- 7. How does the gospel provide for us a means for bringing life through our words?
