SERMON OUTLINE October 21, 2012

Sermon: Pastor Lloyd Pierson, Ph.D. Sermon Series: Philippians Sermon Title: *A Shared Work and Worry* Sermon Text: Philippians 2:19-30

I. Why not Timothy?

II. Why Epaphroditus?

SERMON TEXT: Philippians 2:19-30 (ESV)

2:19 I hope in the Lord Jesus to send Timothy to you soon, so that I too may be cheered by news of you. ²⁰ For I have no one like him, who will be genuinely concerned for your welfare. 21 For they all seek their own interests, not those of Jesus Christ. 22 But you know Timothy's proven worth, how as a son with a father he has served with me in the gospel. ²³ I hope therefore to send him just as soon as I see how it will go with me, 24 and I trust in the Lord that shortly I myself will come also. ²⁵ I have thought it necessary to send to you Epaphroditus my brother and fellow worker and fellow soldier, and your messenger and minister to my need, 26 for he has been longing for you all and has been distressed because you heard that he was ill. ²⁷ Indeed he was ill, near to death. But God had mercy on him, and not only on him but on me also, lest I should have sorrow upon sorrow. ²⁸ I am the more eager to send him, therefore, that you may rejoice at seeing him again, and that I may be less anxious. 29 So receive him in the Lord with all joy, and honor such men, 30 for he nearly died for the work of Christ, risking his life to complete what was lacking in your service to me.

Questions and thoughts for discussion:

- 1. Who was Timothy? What is Paul's reason for sending him to Philippi? Look up: 1 Cor 4:17, 16:10; 1 Thes 3:2-6; Col 1:1; Phil 1:1, Acts 16; Heb 13:23; Rom 16:21.
- 2. Who is Epaphroditus? (Cf Phil 4:18) What service did he provide Paul?
- 3. How are Timothy and Epaphroditus examples of what Paul has been talking about in Ch 2:1-18?
- 4. From this passage, we are reminded that the NT was written in the real world. Why is this important for us to keep in mind? Why do you think some are uncomfortable with these dispalys of humanity in the Bible?
- 5. What do these verses teach us about the nature of Christian ministry?
- 6. What surprises us about Epaphroditus' sickness? Some today say that we should expect healing every time when we pray for others and they often speak of being a NT church. How would you respond to this? Consider: 2 Tim 4:20, 2 Kings 13:14, Mark 6:5.
- 7. What is the meaning of v-30 in making up what was lacking? (Cf. 1 Cor 16:17)
