Introduction: Trade your garbage for gold

SERMON TEXT: Philippians 3:1- (ESV)

3:1 Finally, my brothers, rejoice in the Lord. To write the same things to you is no trouble to me and is safe for you.

² Look out for the dogs, look out for the evildoers, look out for those who mutilate the flesh. 3 For we are the real circumcision, who worship by the Spirit of God and glory in Christ Jesus and put no confidence in the flesh— 4 though I myself have reason for confidence in the flesh also. If anyone else thinks he has reason for confidence in the flesh, I have more: 5 circumcised on the eighth day, of the people of Israel, of the tribe of Benjamin, a Hebrew of Hebrews; as to the law, a Pharisee; ⁶ as to zeal, a persecutor of the church; as to righteousness, under the law blameless. ⁷ But whatever gain I had, I counted as loss for the sake of Christ. 8 Indeed, I count everything as loss because of the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake I have suffered the loss of all things and count them as rubbish, in order that I may gain Christ ⁹ and be found in him, not having a righteousness of my own that comes from the law, but that which comes through faith in Christ, the righteousness from God that depends on faith—¹⁰ that I may know him and the power of his resurrection, and may share his sufferings, becoming like him in his death, 11 that by any means possible I may attain the resurrection from the dead.

Questions and thoughts for discussion:

- 1. In what ways do you put confidence in the flesh? What things do you trust in instead of Christ?
- 2. Have you ever pursued something that was a gain from a worldly perspective, but from a Christian perspective was actually a loss?
- 3. Have you ever endured a great hardship that brought you closer to Christ? What did you learn or gain from that experience?
- 4. Other than your salvation, what about your relationship with Christ has been the most valuable to you? The power to defeat sin in your life? The intimacy of a relationship with him? Hope in the midst of difficult circumstances? Something else?
- 5. What are some concrete ways that you can use your life to display "the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus" to unbelievers? In other words, how can you live your life in such a way that it makes Christ look valuable to unbelievers?
