

SERMON TEXT: Philippians 4:4-9 (ESV)

4:4 Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, Rejoice. ⁵ Let your reasonableness be known to everyone. The Lord is at hand; ⁶ do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. ⁷ And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. ⁸ Finally, brothers, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence, if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things. ⁹ What you have learned and received and heard and seen in me--practice these things, and the God of peace will be with you.

Questions and thoughts for discussion:

- 1. How does vs 8-9 connect with vs 4-7? Does Paul provide practical implications of how the peace of God might guard the believer in moral and intellectual matters?
- 2. The benefits and the blessings of the gospel are personal. We are blessed with his presence, not with trinkets handed to us as gifts. Why is this important to keep in mind when we consider the peace of God coming to us?
- 3. Why is it important to keep in mind that this command to rejoice is given to a congregation and not just to individuals?
- 4. Consider: "The three main things that will come into line if the celebration is both joyful and gentle are the prayer which overcomes anxiety (vs 6-7); the patterns of thought which celebrate God's goodness throughout creation (vs 8); and the style of life which embodies the gospel (vs 9)."—Wright
- 5. How do we go about filling our minds with all the things that God has given to us to enjoy and be pleased with?
- 6. In what way are vs 8-9 "a cross-cultural Christian exhortation in the language of Philippi"? How might this instruct us when we consider how our faith interacts with our culture?
- 7. How does the gospel guide and direct us in dealing with issues that we might differ with other Christians over regarding how to best engage and live in our culture?
